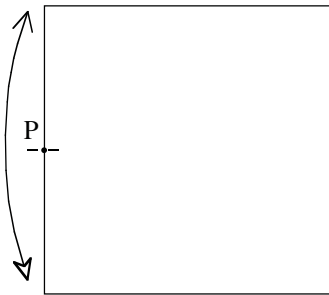

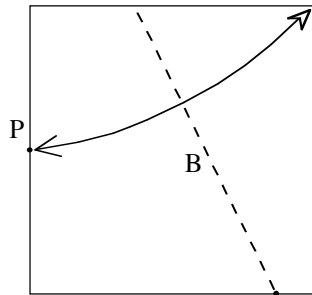

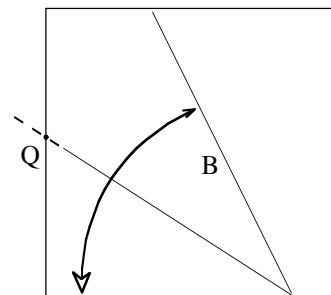
Author's advice: Use a 6-7 inch (15 cm) square of kami, with one light side and one dark side. This model was created to commemorate the year of the ox. I designed it after Giang Dinh sent me his simple and beautiful ox model. Enjoy it but do not publish or distribute it without my permission.



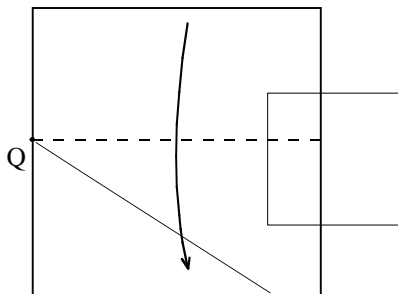
1. Mark the midpoint P of the left side with a crease



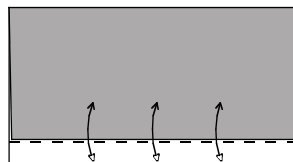
2. Place the top right corner on point P and crease line B lightly.



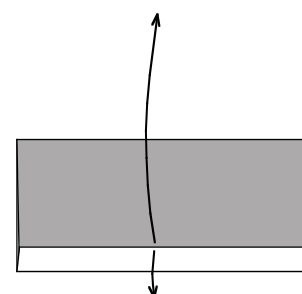
3. Fold the bottom edge to line B and crease the right edge at point Q.



4. Valley-fold the top of the square through point Q.

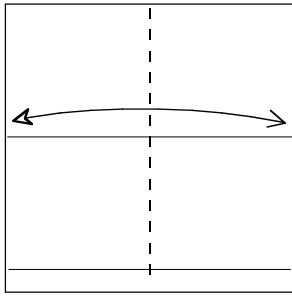


5. Fold and unfold the light colored paper over the edge of dark paper on top of it.

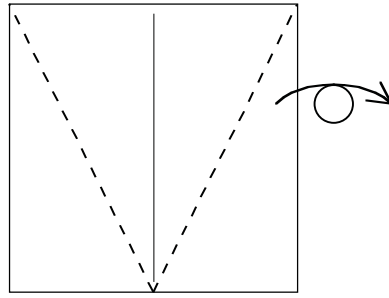


6. Unfold.

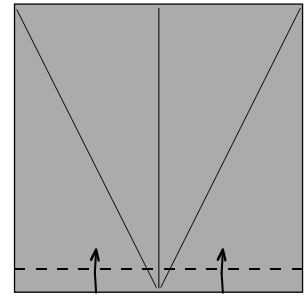




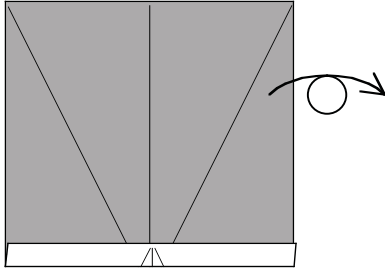
7. Valley fold and unfold the midline.



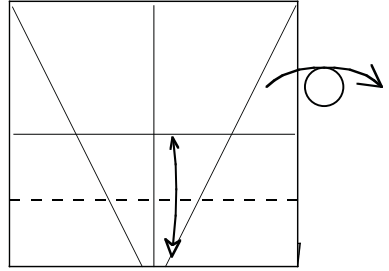
8. Make valley creases from the top corners to the midpoint of the bottom edge. Turn the model over.



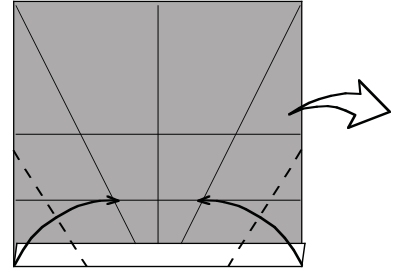
9. Fold the bottom edge up on an existing crease.



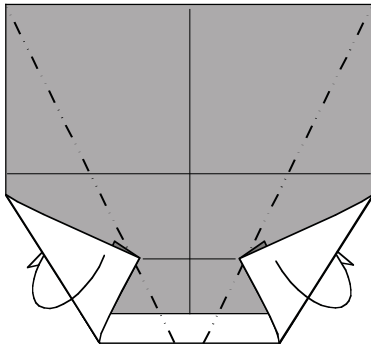
10. Turn the model over.



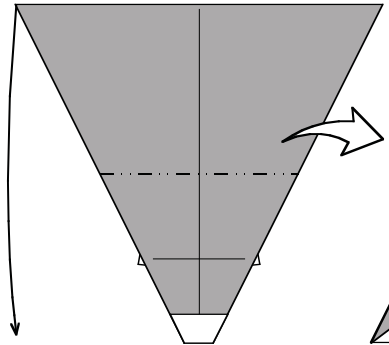
11. Valley fold and unfold the bottom edge to the crease of step 4. Turn the model over.



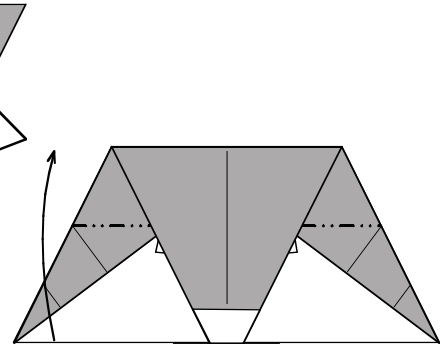
12. Valley fold the corners to lie on the crease just made, and inside the V-shaped creases of step 8. See the next two steps for the result.



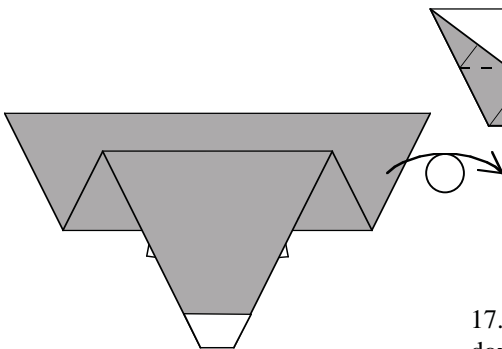
13. Mountain fold the left and right sides behind on the creases of step 8.



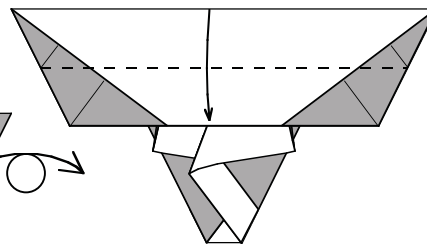
14. Mountain fold the model in half on the crease of step 4. The little light triangles made in step 12 are the eyes.



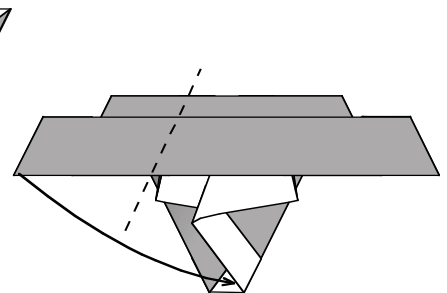
15. Mountain fold the bottom layers up just above the eyes.



16. Turn the model over.

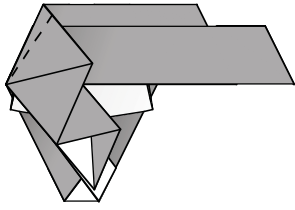


17. Valley fold the top edge down.

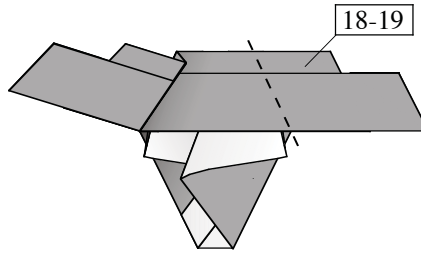


18. Valley fold all the "horn" layers on the left to the edge marked by the arrow.

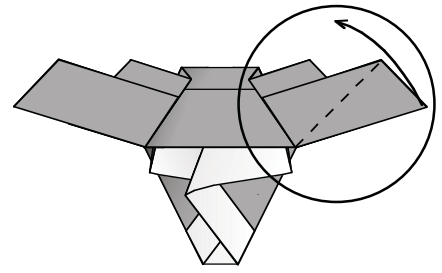




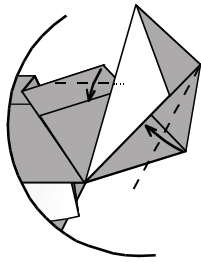
19. Valley fold the horn back to the left.



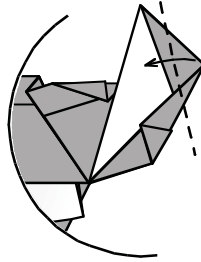
20. Repeat the last two steps on the other horn.



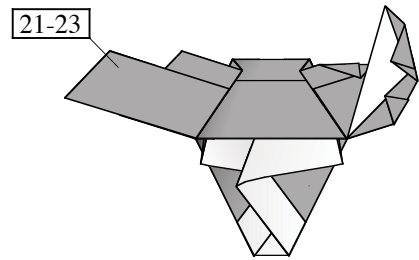
21. Valley fold the horn tip up.



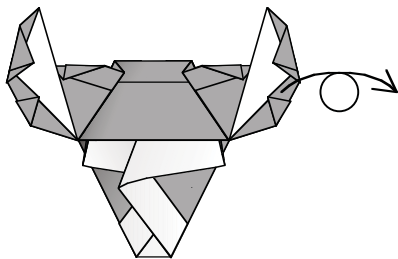
22. Narrow the horn with valley folds.



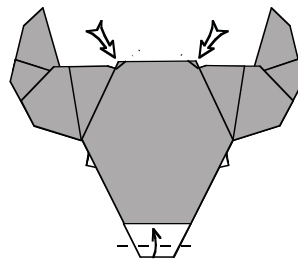
23. Valley fold the indicated edge.



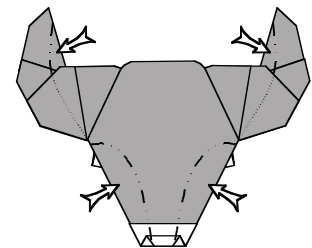
24. Repeat steps 21-23 on the other horn.



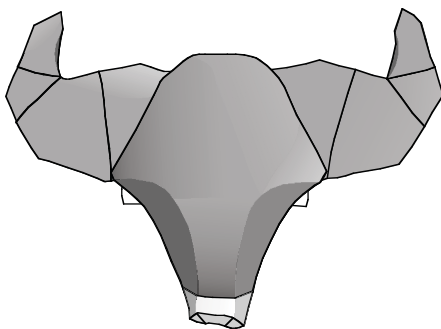
25. Turn the model over.



26. Round the head with inside reverse folds. Fold up the tip of the nose.



27. Shape the horns and sides of the face with curved mountain folds.



Finished ox head! Glue it to greeting cards or turn it over to make other uses.

Carefully insert a chopstick or the eraser side of a pencil through the hole in the nose. You may need to undo the fold on the tip of the nose to insert these items.
