## Caiman

Created / 2012
Difficulty / Intermediate
Time to fold: 30 minutes
Author's advice: It is not a good idea to go swimming after dark in the Amazonian tributaries. Just below the surface there might lurk a caiman, a South American alligator. Fold yours from a bicolored square, white, yellow, or orange on one side for the eyes and teeth; and brown to black for the body.


5. Valley-fold corner to corner.

2. Place the top left corner on the bottom edge midpoint and crease the right side at point $P$.

6. Unfold.

7. Repeat steps 4 to 6 on the other side without rotating.

8. Mountain-fold the right corner behind.

9. Valley-fold through the hidden corner's tip. The edge marked by the dot should be a little above the diagonal.

10. Swivel-fold the other corner of the small triangle to create a narrow eye slit.

11. Pleat the eye so that the mountain fold lies on the dots.

12. Mountain-crease the edge of the "eye" on either side of an imagined eyeball (shaded circle).
 angled valley folds. The model won't lie flat.

15. Valley-fold edges from creases from step 12 and 13 to the end of the lower jaw (dot pair).

16. Pleat the top of the model to mirror the bottom half.


22. Mark the midpoint of the head with a crease.
21. Valley-fold the model in half.

24. Valley-fold the eye flap up where it's top edge touches the midline (dot).

25. Valley-fold the eye flap down.

23. Valley-fold the top right corner to the left side of the head crease.

26. Unfold the last two steps.

27. Crimp the flap symmetrically.

30. Crimp the sides of the eye to round it further.

Mountain-fold it down to cover the cone's entrance.
28. Squash-fold the eye flap into a cone shape.
29. Round the eye by pulling a bit of paper out of the pleat of step 11 at the site of the white arrow.

31. Repeat steps 23-30 on the left eye flap.

32. Turn the model over.

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37. Inside reverse-fold corners. Swivel-fold two "teeth" to the side.

38. Valley-fold the teeth down.

39. Put the upper layer back down.

42. Crimp the upper jaw. Shove it back toward the eyes. The forehead will rise up.

44. Valley-fold lower jaw sides up into the notch of the upper jaw (dots). Spread the teeth to the sides.

40. Mountain-fold one layer underneath.

45. Round the back of the head with mountain folds.
43. Release paper from the midline pleat to raise the forehead some more and make the upper jaw 3-D. X-ray lines show the result of the hidden pleat folds under the top layer. Tuck the eye cones under the pleat if you can.


Optional: Put a magnet on the bottom layer inside the model to attach the caiman to a river or to your refrigerator.
